CHURCH BUILDINGS OPEN - ST SWITHUN'S ON TUESDAYS FROM 10AM -12PM

As you know places of worship have been given the green light to reopen for private prayer. Paul and the churchwardens have worked hard to prepare and clean St Swithun's which will open its doors on Tuesday morning, the first time since March 15th. Of course we all know we can pray anywhere, anytime. But there is something special in praying in a building where over centuries, thousands of people have met, together and individually to celebrate, mourn and pray to God. (You will have received guidance notes on these sessions earlier in the week.)

CHURCH BUILDINGS SHUT

Three months is nothing. St Swithun's was once shut for about ten years as the late 15th century carving of two little boys fighting shows. Apparently in about 1125 there was 'a very great dispute' between two warreners (rabbit keepers and catchers) during the morning service and in the tussle one hit the other over the head and he died. Consequently the church was closed until during King Stephen's visit to Exeter in 1136 when a petition was handed to him to plead with the Bishop to reopen it.
