Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM)

The **APCM** will take place on Sunday 18th April at 11.00am – details of location to follow. This year we will be electing 2 churchwardens, 9 PCC members and 1 Deanery Synod representative. In all cases, anyone on the Church Electoral Roll who is a communicant and willing to be nominated (proposer and seconder required) can stand for election. Please note that persons are disqualified from serving in any of these roles under a variety of conditions which are detailed on the nomination forms. You will also be required to complete 'a Fit and Proper person' declaration.

Churchwardens serve for a term of one year, maximum six consecutive years

PCC members serve for 3 years but are able to retire at any time during this period if they wish to do so. They can stand for re-election. The PCC normally meets about 6 times a year.

The Deanery Synod representative will be elected for a period of two years to fill a vacancy.

Want to know more? If you are interested in any of the above or would like some more info, please could you speak to one of the current churchwardens, Chris Tucker and Linda Bennett-Smith, or Rosanne Baker, the PCC secretary.

Sidespeople are no longer appointed at the APCM but will be elected by the PCC. If there are any sidespeople who wish to retire or if there is anybody who is interested in becoming a sidesperson, please could you speak to Rosanne.
