# THY KINGDOM COME - 13TH TO 23RD MAY

In recent years, during the ten days between Ascencion (when we remember Jesus returning to Heaven) and Pentecost (when we remember the coming of the Holy Spirit) we have been encouraged to pray more. One initiative is that we each **pray4five.** Ask yourself 'who do I know who is precious to God – but doesn't know that yet?' It may be your next door neighbour, it may be a world leader. Then pray for your five chosen people during those ten days, that they know how God values and loves them and choose to turn to him.

Another initiative in churches and dioceses around the world is to share praying through those ten days for your community, nation and world (that's 240 hours of non-stop prayer!). ### Sunday's Readings: Acts 10:44-48; Psalm 98; 1 John 5:1-6; John 15:18-21

I love reading the book of Acts, it consists of tales of ordinary people who turned to Jesus, asked God to forgive them, were baptised in water and in the Holy Spirit and whoosh they were off! In Jesus' name and by his authority they spoke to individuals or to crowds of thousands who were so moved they would cry out 'What must I do to be saved?' In Jesus' name they healed people, drove out evil spirits and performed mighty miracles. It's true as followers of Jesus they were also beaten, imprisoned, persecuted or even killed. But like them or hate them the new Christians were impossible to ignore. As we approach the period between Ascencion and Pentecost, ask yourself what sort of church do you want to be part of?
