## Welcome to the 16th edition of the Hub Post

I am reminded every day, as I drive around the parishes, of God's goodness. We live in a beautiful part of the world and God's generous provision is evident all around us, with green fields, majestic trees, birds, animals – all there for us to appreciate and take care of. God's creation is an incredibly magnificent thing and what a gift. My mind boggles when I think of how creative God is, given the diversity of life on earth. Recently, I was reminded of the special places that are our churchyards. As you will read at the end of this edition of the Hub Post, a young Dormouse was found in the bell tower at Woolsery. It had fallen into a bucket, after managing to climb up onto the old organ kept in there. Dormice are protected and endangered, and yet, there we had one in our church. The said Dormouse is now at a local Dormouse rescue centre, where it will be kept until it is able to build its own nest and will then be returned to the hedgerow in Woolsery churchyard. Who knew we had endangered Dormice in our churchyards. You will also read about wildlife in the Sandford churchyard towards the end of the Hub Post. Our churchyards are teeming with life. How wonderful!

Our old church buildings are peaceful places of quiet when there isn't something going on in them. They are places of refuge for us, God's people, where we can encounter God in the quiet beauty of the buildings. Outside those buildings we are surrounded by the beauty of creation. Our churchyards can be safe havens for amazing wildlife. When we sit still for a moment, whether in a church building or out in our beautiful surroundings, we can get a sense of God's awesomeness. The quiet of an empty church building or the bird song outside, can enable us to encounter God in a new way.

May our churches and churchyards be places of refuge for all of us, including God's little creatures. When you are next walking in the countryside, sitting in your garden or sitting in a churchyard, take a moment to appreciate God's goodness and provision of life for all of us.

When caring for the churchyard, remember that there are precious creatures living in it. Let us continue to make our churchyards places of refuge for God's creation.



Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths – Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.



**GROW COURSES** offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom.

Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role.

This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.

### **Sandford Churchyard**

Records show that on the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 1524 the churchyard was consecrated for burials and St Swithun's was licensed to receive the burial fees. Useful income for the church! Were people buried in Sandford before that and the bigger church at Crediton received the burial fees? Or were there no burials at St Swithun's because the ground wasn't consecrated? So far we have found no answers but would love to know more.

Walking along the church path once with Andrew White (Funeral Director) he asked, 'Have you ever wondered why in old churches like this the burial area is so much higher than the paths and the land around?' Well I hadn't, but it clearly was, especially from the Fanny's Lane gate. He

answered his own question. 'There are hundreds of bodies buried here, the majority with no marker anymore. And that raises the height of the churchyard.'

Anyway, on a beautifully sunny Saturday morning at the end of April, almost 500 years to the day of the consecration, we had a big Plant Sale out in the churchyard while refreshments were served in the Under Gallery. It was a super social occasion, not all the conversations were about plants(!) and a variety of scrummy cakes were enjoyed. We made just over £470 for church and churchyard funds and thank you to all who came. With the help of Steve (McCulloch) and a better management plan, the churchyard has become a hospitable environment to a wide range of wildlife from hedgehogs and harvest mice, to slow worms and bats. I have recently discovered the joy of an app called Merlin, which identifies bird song. Standing on the church steps one morning last week and using the app, it identified 10 different varieties of birds around me in just 1 minute – and that didn't include the house martins I could see in the Square! The churchyard is truly a wonderful place, do take the time to wander through and enjoy it.
