

### Welcome to the 22nd edition of the Hub Post

Christmas is fast approaching and everything becomes very busy and sometimes stressful. As we enter Advent, looking forward to the coming of Christ the King, let us take a step back and breathe. Take a look around you and find some space to take in the love of God. God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, Jesus Christ. Jesus came to earth as a tiny, helpless baby and experienced all the joys and sorrows of earthly life, so that we can be with God forever. He gave up His life so that we might live. As He has loved us, so we are called to love Him and to love one another. Loving one another doesn't just mean loving the people we like, it is about loving even those who we don't like, or who don't treat us with kindness.

As you prepare for Christmas, look for signs of God in your everyday life. He can be found in the most unexpected places. You may find Him in the people around you. In a world that is full of pain and suffering, Jesus enters in as a helpless baby, born to a young poor couple who said yes to God. The wonder of the Christmas story invades my heart every year. God, who created everything, comes to earth to love us and show us how to live – loving each other and loving God. The Nativity story never gets old. It is the most wonderful story ever told. It is a story of hope and light in the darkness. When we say yes to God, we say yes to a life of certainty that God will never leave us, that even in the dark times of our lives, He is there with us, helping us through. If this time of year is difficult for you, ask God to come and invade the darkness and bring His light and love. He longs for relationship with us, to walk with us through whatever life throws at us here on earth, until it is time for us to go to our real home in heaven, where we will live forever.

# FOUNDATIONS


The Foundations Course is designed to help people in Devon grow in their discipleship, and flourish as part of the Church. It includes an introduction to the Bible, theology, spirituality and mission, delivered in an accessible way.

Teaching is a mixture of in-person group sessions and online learning. The course will run in the following locations:

**GROW COURSES** offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon

with joy through practical and specific

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

### St. Matthew's Church, Coldridge News and dates:

November started with a 'bang' at St Matthew's! As part of our community outreach mission, we hosted a very popular and musically highly professional '**JAZZ IN THE NAVE**' concert. This took place in the church on the evening of Friday, 1st. The performance, by local musician Jonny Monument and his Moon Club Jazz Band, suited our ancient building absolutely superbly. The ambience, the acoustic, our mellow, ancient woodwork and our rather dim and out-dated lighting were just what was needed to provide a warm, 'cosy' yet perfect atmosphere for this novel event. Audience members came from as far afield as Plymouth and Nymet Rowland! We opened the church to a lot of 'new' friends and, in so doing, raised over £500 for our Bell Restoration Fund.

Our **Service of Remembrance**, on Sunday 10th, was beautifully led by Rev. Peter Rapsey and was attended by 50 people outside, and with over 40 in the church. The sun shone, it was lovely and warm and the Act of Remembrance was suitably solemn and reverent. The service following, in church, was enhanced by spoken reminiscences: The 6 names from WW1 were researched and their stories described by Ivan Kriznik and, following this, Marion Born told us of her Uncle Gordon Dart, who went to France on D Day, driving a tank, and who was killed at the end of August 1944, along with all of his tank crew. These very local and poignant stories certainly made us think about all those who never came home. We sent a very generous Collection (£273.14) to **Combat Stress**.

**Sunday, 15th**: Service of **Holy Communion** (Common Worship) at 10.30am. This service will be led by Rev. Peter Rapsey.

### St. Swithun's, Sandford

So now we are in the season of Advent culminating in the joy of Christmas. It's a season when children play a big part, center stage really.

And as it happens we have seen a lot of children at St Swithun's recently. On November 10th we commemorated Remembrance Day and were joined by Sandford Scouts and their leaders. The service in the church, (well done Scouts Isla and Aria form their skill in the memory game) was led by Revd Jeremy Putnam followed by the Act of civic remembrance in the village square.

On the last Sunday of November we had the joy of a christening. Jesse and Jess, who farm at Henstill, were joined by family and friends for the baptism of Elsie and George.

Sandford school children have also been active recently. We already have a team (Sandford Storytellers) who go into the school every fortnight to perform a bible story for a whole school assembly. Afterwards the children are encouraged to reflect on the story and ask questions.

Creedy Class spent an afternoon learning about bells when a visiting group of ringers from the Exeter area came to St Swithun's. The children tried out the handbells and watched the ringers raise the bells and ring a peal.

Tavy Class came to the churchyard to help plant whips along the Devon hedge we are creating and then do some 'bulb bombing'. They planted bulbs along the edges of paths and by the walls ready for spring.

Finally, children from Dart Class are coming in December to sing some of the Christmas songs they are learning at the Wednesday morning Coffee and Company sessions we run every week.

We look forward to the whole school coming for their Nativity service on Friday 13th.

And then our legendary Crib Service to a packed church at 4pm on Christmas Eve. This has been running for over 20 years and it is wonderful to welcome back adults who remember first coming along as wide-eyed toddlers.
