


Welcome to the 24th edition of the Hub Post

February is often a month of change, and we hope we'll see the first signs of spring at this time. February also marks the move from the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany seasons to the start of Lent, which this year begins on March 5th.

Epiphany ends with 'The Presentation of Christ in the Temple' on 2nd February, or 'Candlemas'. Why this name? This was due to its being the feast day when traditionally the candles to be used both in church and in people's homes throughout the year were blessed. This brings us to the gospel story for Candlemas.

People can be puzzled that the baby Jesus reappears over a month after Christmas Day. Surely this all ended with the Wise Men at Epiphany? Not quite! In St Luke's Gospel, chapter 2, Jesus is brought by his parents to the Temple in Jerusalem, where he is 'presented', and sacrifices to God are offered for him.

According to Jewish Law - which, as observant Jews, Joseph and Mary followed - this takes place forty days after the child's birth. Hence 2nd February - forty days after Christmas. While the Holy Family is in the Temple, they are met by two people -Simeon, who is almost certainly a priest, and a prophet called Anna. Both have been waiting and praying for God to bring his salvation and redemption his freedom and justice - through his Messiah (which means 'God's Anointed') who will bring in God's promised kingdom. Both Simeon and Anna talk to Mary and Joseph about the great significance of their young child. Through the power of God's Spirit, Simeon realizes that this child is the one promised by God, and he takes the child in his arms and says a prayer - we know it as the 'Nunc Dimittis'. This title is just the first two words in Latin of the song itself. It became quite quickly a key part of the Church's worship:

"Now, Lord, you let your servant go in peace: your word has been fulfilled. My own eyes have seen the salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of every people - a light to reveal you to the nations, and the glory of your people Israel."

Simeon understands that Jesus is and will be the Light of the world - a phrase, of course, that the adult Jesus uses about himself. Candlemas has a 'bitter-sweet' quality as it simultaneously points backwards to Christmas (our last look back at Christmas as it marks the end of the Christmas season) and forward to Jesus' passion and the cross. Because of this, Candlemas has also sometimes been described as a pivotal moment in the Christian year. Pivotal moments are times when we are called to take stock and to discern where God might be leading us. Simeon was utterly surprised that the Messiah was in the form of a vulnerable baby. Will we allow God to surprise us too?

we cry out to you in the midst of the pain and trauma of violence and fear which prevails in the Holy Land.


Be with those who need you in these days of suffering; we pray for people of all faiths - Jews, Muslims and Christians and for all people of the land.

FOUNDATIONS


The Foundations Course is designed to help people in Devon grow in their discipleship, and flourish as part of the Church. It includes an introduction to the Bible, theology, spirituality and mission, delivered in an accessible way.

Teaching is a mixture of in-person group sessions and online learning. The course will run in the following locations:

GROW COURSES offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.
