

Thought for the month

In the Greek Orthodox Church, on the Monday after Easter the faithful come together to exchange jokes. The custom lies in the belief that Easter Sunday brought about the greatest "joke" in history: Jesus' resurrection, a divine triumph over death. Behind each joke, no matter how appalling and unfunny, lies an important truth for these Christians. That love has won the day.

[Joke] Jesus said to Jonny, "Come forth, and you shall receive eternal life," but Jonny came fifth and received a toaster.

Sorry, that's the best I've got.

Easter traditions are found all over the globe. In certain regions of Mexico, Easter is marked with the ancient "Dance of the Flyers," where performers climb a tall pole, tie themselves to ropes, and spin downward in a breathtaking display of devotion and tradition. In Poland, "Śmigus-Dyngus," is celebrated with a water fight! Buckets, water guns, and anything that can hold water are fair game. There's also 'Butter Lambs' in Russia, 'Easter Bilbies' in Australia, light whipping in Slovakia, egg cracking in Greece, and kite flying in Bermuda. Amazing!

Of all the traditions around the world I really like the Greek Orthodox affinity for laughing. it shows that like the Christmas season, Easter is the experience of joyfully knowing and coming to believe in, the unexpected God. Who shows us, in His great goodness that through the most unexpected ending we are more loved and treasured than we could possibly imagine. The truth that nothing can separate us from the love of God (Romans 8:35) not even death, is the greatest punchline in human history, and more than that, a source of such deep and abundant joy that you and I can experience this new life today.

Now, we have our own traditions in the UK. Hot cross buns, (although that's strictly Good Friday), Morris dancing, baking eating simnel cake with 11 marzipan balls on top, and of course, Easter Eggs, hunts, and egg rolling.

I'm sure you've not missed the vast range of Easter Eggs in our supermarkets. There is standard and luxury, small and enormous, wrapped, boxed, free-from, vegan, themed, you name it, you can find it.

Out of all of these, my favourite Easter Eggs are the boring ones with nothing inside. At first you feel a bit shortchanged, but this is the tradition that all Christians belong to, subscribe to, and are compelled to keep to. That the tomb, the symbol of life which the eggs are designed to remind us of, was indeed empty. 'Why do you seek the living among the dead?' said the messengers to the women at the tomb. 'He is not here, he is risen!'

So, rejoice in your empty Easter egg! And may the empty tomb be the joy that sustains, keeps, blesses, encourages, and inspires you this day, and each day to come. May the God of all joy, be your joy this Eastertide.



St George's College, Jerusalem is, The Anglican Centre for Pilgrimage, Education, Hospitality and Reconciliation.

Alongside St George's Anglican Cathedral, in East Jerusalem, which is situated on occupied Palestinian Land.

Pilgrims from all faiths and none have been welcomed for some 60 plus years to experience and gain more understanding, not only of the Holy sites of Biblical times, but also of the complexity of living in such a volatile area in today's world.

The Diocese of Jerusalem is currently led by Archbishop Hosam Naoum, which is responsible for Palestine, Israel, Syria, Jordan & Lebanon.

Much of the work throughout the Diocese is to look after not only 33 churches, but maintain, run and solely fund 34 institutions such as schools, hospitals and clinics. These include, The Princess Basma Centre for Disabled Children and their families, and the,

Al Ahli Hospital in Northern Gaza, both of which the generous people of Crediton have supported for the last couple of years.

Since the current War the College has had to close thus no funds coming in from the visit of pilgrims. Archbishop Hosam is crying out for help, it is vital that the work there continues. They are very grateful to the Cadbury Deanery for helping with these Lent Lunches. Please give what you can.

Dear Friends,

"Give and it shall be given to you. A good measure, pressed down, shaken together and running over" Luke 6.38

We want to thank everyone across the Diocese for your gracious generosity, hard work and creativity, undergirded by persistent prayer, and we thank God that our collective efforts have continued to enable the funding of mission and ministry in 2024. You have raised £8.3m in Common Fund and we give thanks for the generosity of so many in economically challenging times. Common fund contributions go principally to providing stipends for clergy and without everyone's contribution we would not be able to sustain our stipendiary clergy numbers. We are delighted that many of our parishes met their full contribution and three parishes paid *over* their request to support those unable to meet their commitments.

We appreciate that for many parishes, benefices and Mission Communities, the last few years may have left your financial situation weakened and our Mission Resources team are here to help and support you as we continue to adapt and change. New ways of giving help future proof the giving to parishes and we recommend that, if you have not already done so, you explore introducing the Parish Giving Scheme (PGS), contactless devices, QR codes or on-line possibilities. Please contact the team at mission resources@exeter.anglican.org for any questions. If you are undertaking a stewardship campaign and you would like one of the bishops to speak at a particular service or event then, diary willing, we would be delighted to help.

Plymouth: Oct '24 - Mar '25



Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.
