

# **Thought for the month**

As we prepare for Lent, that special time of preparation before Easter, I am still wrestling with the fact that we are already two months into the New Year. If we are not careful, Lent can come and go without us noticing much, with all our focus on the glorious joy of Easter. The 40 days of Lent give us an opportunity to reflect on the journey that Jesus made, as He prepared for what He knew was coming at His crucifixion and the great sacrifice that He made for us on the cross.

Easter is the reason we are Christians. Jesus died on a cross and rose again, so that we can be restored back to God. But there is no Easter without the journey to the cross and Good Friday. I find this time of year a very moving time. We begin Lent with Ash Wednesday and we hold services where we make the sign of the cross with ash on our foreheads. The use of ashes is a simple reminder of our human frailty, and of our dependence upon the grace of God.

As human beings, we don't like to think of ourselves as sinners. We like to think that we are good people. St. Paul reminds us that we are all sinners and all fall short of the glory of God. It is our human condition. Lent gives us an opportunity to look at our frailty as human beings and to draw close to Jesus, as He calls us to examine our hearts and to repent of our sinfulness. I encourage you to join a Lent group, spend more time in prayer, more time reading your Bible and consciously journeying through Lent, asking God to reveal himself to you in new and wonderful ways.

God loves every single one of us, whether we recognise that or not. There is the wonderful and true saying that says that there is nothing you can do to make God love you more and there is nothing you can do to make Him love you less. Allow that thought to sink into your heart as you reflect on your own journey of faith this Lent.

# **The Hub Update**

The Hub offers us an opportunity to explore innovative ideas and vision for rural ministry. Our hope is to bring together rural churches to share in mission and ministry, creating a sustainable model of church for rural communities; rooted in the Diocesan Vision of Pray, Grow, Serve.

The Hub looks forward as we embrace a new future for the rural church. It seeks to enable churches, people and communities to work together to provide ministry across a large area. It has collaboration and cooperation at its heart as it seeks to find ways for the local church to share resources and support each other in our common mission, whilst recognising the gifts that come from our being rooted in each parish context. Its vision is for the network of churches that make up the current North Creedy East, North Creedy West and Crediton Mission Communities to be like the body of Christ. One body, with many parts; a group of churches intentionally, structurally, and strategically sharing resources to support the collective mission and ministry offered within the local area. What this will look like on the ground is parishes teaming up in clusters, sharing resources and discerning what God is calling them to do in their communities, whilst also having more than an eye on the wider Church too. Let's not forget that as well as the local church, we are part of The Church, which is global or to put it another way... universal.

A key element of us acting like the body of Christ... one body, with many parts... in this part of Devon is the empowering, equipping and resourcing of lay people to exercise their skills and gifts in Chrisitan ministry. Each one of us has a baptismal vocation and so each one of us is called to take our part in serving God in this part of Devon... the Rural Ministry Hub is a major step towards realising this vision. Discipleship and prayer and effective communication links are key to the success of the opportunity before us.

### So Far...

The various ministers, lay and ordained, meet on a Wednesday at 9am for prayer. Everyone is welcome to join us for this time of fellowship and it would be great to see you... a warm welcome awaits.

In autumn 2022 and again in autumn 2024 we held Confirmation services following shared Hub preparation sessions.

On March 15th we are offering a Marriage Preparation Day for all couples across the Hub who will be married in our churches. This follows similar successful events in 2023 and 2024.

We have offered various courses over the past two years, including one on prayer using material by Pete Greig. We are about to offer a shared Lent course which meets at various times and in various locations to maximise participation. And beginning in Easter we will be hosting an Alpha Course for anyone interested in the Christian faith, and the big questions of life.

In the coming months, those engaged in children's work will begin to meet to share creative ideas and offer to support parishes where needed.

The Hub Post... which you are reading now... is an online publication designed to keep us abreast of happenings in the various parishes. A limited number of paper copies are made available for those without computer access.

We also meet monthly to plan rotas for worship and to share missional ideas.

We'll always be on the lookout for new vocations. We currently have someone on the Pioneering Ministry course and someone else completing the Catalyst course for children's work. We also have people who have completed the Launchpad youth work course.

We are also blessed to have our retired clergy who give so freely of their time.

We are planning courses on pastoral care and lay worship leading in order to equip people for these vital ministries.

## Going forward...

The licensed ministry team currently comprises: Matthew Tregenza, Janet May, Jeremy Putnam, Sandra Collier, Carol Price and Antonia Tregenza. It would be great if we could expand this!

As we go to press, we have heard that we can look to appoint a new full-time colleague with pastoral oversight for the existing North Creedy West parishes and who will contribute a specialist ministry to the wider Hub too.

Our hopes and longings are for a Church which is set free to serve God using all the resources He has given us (and these are countless) and through which the Holy Spirit blows encouragement for people to discover their giftings and then to use them. We long too for a Church which goes outside of its 'comfort zone' to take risks for the sake of the Gospel. The Hub encourages us to do all these things... let's not lose the opportunity so richly given to us, but let's boldly walk this path together as fellow pilgrims and disciples of Christ!







This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.
