



Welcome to the 34th edition of the Hub Post

During Advent we waited. Children waited for the term to end. Adults waited for the holiday offered by Christmas. Children waited again (more or less) for Father Christmas. We experienced the happiness of the day, the carol services, the solemnity of the holy communion services. We have endured snow, ice and driving rain. We saw out the old year and welcomed in the new, with all its hopes, expectations and promise.

In Lapford, the children are enjoying their new school name and uniform, when Bishop Moira came to cut the ribbon and celebrate with parents, teachers and the church. We look forward to the closer links between the church building and the school. Colebrooke is rejoicing in its newly formed PCC and churchwardens and looking forward in faith and love to all this year will bring. There are so many other examples of the good things that are happening. Our busy church life in mid Devon is the exemplar of what should be happening in the diocese – and I am quoting the archdeacon.

We waited again for the arrival of the three kings at Epiphany and thought about the meaning of the word (epiphany means revelation or new understanding) that these foreigners brought to the birth of God amongst us - Emmanuel, God with us.

Now we are approaching another time of waiting. Ash Wednesday is on the 18th February and we are back in a time of waiting: Lent. Finally, there is Easter, with the loss and sadness of those few days of Passion Week put aside in the joy of the resurrection.

By then it will be Spring, or nearly so. The promise that we can see in the flowers and the leaves on the trees echoes God's promise to us that God will never leave us and whatever we do, God is faithful and keeps God's promises. We remember too that the seed must be buried in the earth before the green blade rises.

The point of waiting is time. Although it can be hard to do, waiting is what gives us the time to reflect, to pray, to remember what is important. What can we give? After all, loving is the only thing that is increased by giving it away. So waiting is a time for loving, being with one another, worshipping together, enjoying each other and thereby, enjoying God too.







children - for to all of us, you are our Heavenly Father.


In Jesus' name we pray,

GROW COURSES offer introductory learning opportunities for a wide range of roles over Zoom. Primarily for lay people, these courses can be accessed by anyone and may be used as part of their discernment process or as learning for a current or future role. This project aims to help our church members to grow in prayer, make new disciples and serve the people of Devon with joy through practical and specific learning.

Courses are certificated and can be undertaken without prior learning. Some participants join before or after undertaking Foundations in Christian Ministry, but these courses stand alone. Public recognition of this learning is really valuable, so we'd encourage all churches to acknowledge those who complete Grow courses. These courses can also be arranged as in-person training, if we have enough people to run a course in the Deanery.

Current courses include Digital Ministry, Prayer, Sharing our Faith, Children, Youth & Schools, Leading from the Front, Carbon Literacy, Creation Care, Pastoral Care, Social Action, Administration, Preaching, Small Group Leadership and more. These are always being added to and suggestions of new subjects are welcome.

News from Holy Cross Crediton

As I write this towards the end of January, it feels that church life has returned to normal after all the joy and excitement of Christmas. But it is still the season of Epiphany and Candlemas and on Sunday 1 February at 6pm, there is a Carol Service at Holy Cross to celebrate this.

Many readers of this newsletter will be aware of the financial challenges that face churches. I recently received the latest National Churches Trust newsletter which contained the following:- “New data from Historic England shows that the public are largely unaware of who foots the bill for church repairs. Only 11% of people knew that the responsibility for the upkeep of historic churches falls on the shoulders of the local congregation, including any staff – but in almost all cases it is mainly volunteers – at each church, chapel or meeting house. There is no consistent UK Government funding for these buildings – other than a VAT reclaim scheme that has been slashed and could be scrapped in the next few months – even though these buildings are some of the nation’s most important heritage. Grade I, II* or II listed buildings that house the most amazing art – stained glass, monuments, wall paintings – spanning hundreds and hundreds of years. If you want to see church buildings kept open and in good repair, please consider writing to your local newspaper or contacting your MP and highlight why church buildings matter and why you support them being properly funded.”

And of course it's not just repairs. There are also contributions to the Common Fund (which essentially pays for the clergy) and the day to day running costs – all falling on the same shoulders.

On a lighter note, February sees the first event organised by our Social Committee to raise funds for Crediton PCC while also having a good time. This is the Wine Tasting with Food evening on Saturday 28 February at 7pm.
